ELIGIBILITY AND REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- Child must reside in the school's attendance boundary for initial VPK lottery participation.
- KG participation is through attendance boundary, McKay Scholarship or Approved Transfers.
- Parents must provide all required school entry registration documents.
- Parents must complete the following:
 - Emergency Student Data Form (FM-2733)
 - Home Language Survey (FM-5196)
 - Family Application for Free and Reduced Price Meals (online)
 - Pre-Kindergarten Screenings Consent (FM-5490)
 - School appointments for screenings will be scheduled for VPK and KG

WHY IS VPK/KG IMPORTANT FOR YOUR CHILD?

- Did you know that children who participate in highquality, early learning experiences benefit from improved social skills, higher academic achievement, and enhanced attention spans?
- There is overwhelming evidence that suggests that children who participate in highquality preschool programs develop stronger math and reading skills and a full range of competencies necessary for school success.



VPK INFORMATION AND CRITERIA

- Florida's Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Education Program -VPK is a free, highquality educational program that prepares 4-yearolds for kindergarten and beyond.
- To be eligible for VPK, children must be four (4) years old on or before September 1st.
- If the child's fourth birthday falls between February 2nd and September 1st in a calendar year, parents may postpone enrolling their child in VPK until the following year when the child is 5 years old.

WHAT DOES MY CHILD NEED TO KNOW BEFORE HE OR SHE STARTS KINDERGARTEN?

Reading Readiness Skills

- Recognizes most or all the capital and lowercase letters and knows the sounds they make
- Writes his/her name with capital letter at the beginning followed by lower case letters
- Knows the difference between a letter and a word
- Pretends to read books
- Points to each word as they read beginning from front to back, top to bottom, and left to right
- Answers questions about what has been read such as Who? What? When? Where?
- Recognizes rhyming words
- Recognizes beginning sound of words
- Speaks using complete sentences most of the time

Mathematics Readiness Skills

- Uses words and representations to describe mathematical ideas
- Begins to recognize patterns and makes simple generalizations
- Counts with understanding
- Shows beginning understanding of number and quantity
- Orders, compares, and describes objects according to a single attribute
- Participates in measuring activities
- Shows understanding of and uses several positional words
- Begins to recognize and describe the attributes of shapes
- Composes and decomposes shapes

KG CLASS CAPACITY AND VPK LOTTERY INFORMATION

- The maximum capacity in a VPK class is 20 students
- KG recommended size is 18.
- If a school has more eligible applicants than the allotted seats available, a lottery must be conducted for VPK only.
- Only families who have submitted the required documents showing proof of age and address will be considered to participate in the school's VPK lottery selection process.
- Parents of students living outside the school's attendance boundary may also attend KLE if there are spaces available through transfers or McKay Scholarships.
- A separate waiting list for these students will be maintained for Pre-K only.
- If there are open VPK seats after placing all in-boundary students, we will conduct a lottery with the out- of-boundary student list to fill the remaining VPK seats.

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS AND LOTTERY INFORMATION

- Schools will need to send the name and ID number of any student with an IEP selected in the VPK Lottery to the ESE Department representative to allow the ESE team to review the student's needs, and to determine if the VPK class is the most appropriate setting for that student.
- The COE is not required to participate in the school's VPK lottery selection process.
- The VPK lottery will take place at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, February 24, 2023.
- If the child's name is not selected during the lottery process, a parent may choose to keep the child's name on a waiting list at the school or choose to enroll the child in another public school with open seats.
- All parents must be notified of their child's enrollment status that resulted from the VPK lottery selection process, by Friday, March 3, 2023.



INCLUSION & ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

- KLE has an extensive inclusion and enrichment program for students from Pre-K through 5th grade.
- The KLE Inclusion Program was created to provide opportunities for Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten children with disabilities to interact with typically developing peers.
- Typically developing children (children without special needs) who serve as role models, attend the full-day Pre-Kindergarten Inclusion/Reverse Mainstream class at no cost to the parent.
- They participate in all classroom activities, field trips, and parent education meetings.
- Typically developing children must be 4 years old on or before September 1st of the current school year and have a COE to participate.
- Unfilled VPK seats may be filled with 3-year-old children.
- There are no income or attendance boundary requirements for typically developing children; however, parents must provide transportation.
 - These programs are located at both Title I and non-Title I schools.

VPK ATTENDANCE

- VPK Attendance Procedures Student attendance is reported daily utilizing the District's Electronic Gradebook System.
- VPK Programs must follow School Board Policy 5200 Attendance as with all K-12 students. To comply with the uniform attendance policy for funding the VPK Program (8:20 a.m. – 11:20 a.m.), attendance records must be accurate.
- We will complete a VPK Child Attendance and Parental Choice Certificate (Long Form OEL-VPK 03L, 2/14/2007) for each student.
 - We will attach the monthly electronic attendance record from PF7 in DSIS, and need to secure the parent's or guardian's signature in blue ink, at the end of each month before the 5th of the following month.
 - We must retain the documents on file for five years in the school's office for audit purposes

Exceptional Student Education Services (ESE)

- Students entering Miami-Dade County Public
 Schools with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) will receive continued services.
- Upon registration, please present a copy of the IEP or inform the school of any special needs or accommodations needed for your child.

- Before School Care 7 am start time (\$4 per day)
- After School Care Mini Care Program after school until second dismissal time (\$4 per day)
- After School Program after school until 6 pm (\$8 or \$7 per day depending on eligibility for F&R Meal Program)
- You must purchase the required insurance for after school activities (\$13)
- You must utilize the online monthly payment system through an account you set up via the District's portal
