The academic progress of students must be monitored to ensure that students are mastering the standards for a grade level or course. In accordance with the requirements of Florida Statutes § 1008.25, each student who does not achieve a Level 3 or above on the statewide, standardized English Language Arts assessment (FSA FAST ELA), or the statewide, standardized Mathematics must be evaluated to determine the nature of the student's difficulty, the areas of academic need, and strategies for providing academic supports to improve the student's performance. Parents must be provided with results from the state's FAST Progress Monitoring Assessments, available on the Florida Family Portal (https://fl-familyportal.cambiumast.com/#/) within two weeks of administration in accordance with Florida Statutes § 1008.25.	The parent must be notified in writing at any time during a grading period when it is apparent that the student may fail or is doing unsatisfactory work in any course or grade assignment. Parents should also be notified in writing when a student is receiving instruction in an accelerated class or grade placement to include courses taken with Florida Virtual School and/or other district-approved online courses. An acknowledgment of the receipt of such notification by the parent should be obtained. Parents must also be provided with results from the state's FAST Progress Monitoring Assessments within two weeks of administration in accordance with Florida Statutes § 1008.25.
